**Mr. William McCoy** - An inspiring motivational speaker, Mr. McCoy is a hands-on expert in planning, training, development and community improvement. He is one of four African-Americans in the nation certified to work on behalf of the U.S. Department of Justice on the issue of disproportionate minority contact with the (juvenile) justice system.

**Ms. Stacey Bush** - Now a senior at Grand Blanc High School, Ms. Bush was the first Caucasian child to be adopted by an African American family in the State of Michigan. She has received numerous awards and scholarships, including the Margaret Lochman Scholarship, the Boys and Girls Club's 2007 Youth of the Year Award and the C.S. Mott Foundation's Leadership Academy Award. Ms. Bush will speak of her experiences while in the child welfare system.
